Models of Financing

- Larger Capitated Rate to Medical Home
- Pay BH to practice in Medical Home
- Pay Medical providers to practice in BH centers

Models of Financing

- Integrated Case Managers
- BH and Medical in same location
- Share EHR



Health Behavior Assessment Intervention

- April 1, 2014
- Less than 20 years old
- Medical diagnosis
- Biopsychosocial factors
- Colocation of Licensed Practitioner Healing Arts (LPHA) and Primary Care Physician (PCP)
- 96150-96155
- Texas Medicaid Health Partners (TMPH) website
- LPHA to have own National Provider Identification (NPI), use PCP office address/ billing service

Same Day Billing

- May vary by plan
 - plans have been told to cover both medical and BH providers
- FQHCs included
- May be a problem if same procedure code is used

Texas Health Steps

- 2/28/14
 - THSteps Advisory Panel recommended specific mental/behavioral health screening as part of the checkup for clients 12 years of age (older if not completed at 12 yr. checkup)
- 1 of the 4 approved tools
 - Pediatric Symptom Checklist (PSC-35)
 - Pediatric Symptom Checklist-Youth (PSC-Y)
 - Personal health Questionnaire-9 (PHQ-9)
 - CRAFFT

E and M codes

- Physician evaluation and management established patient procedure codes:
 - 99211 - Usually the presenting problem(s) are minimal and typically 5 minutes are spent with the patient or supervising the services
 - 99212 - Usually the presenting problem(s) are self-limited or minor and typically 10 minutes are spent with the patient or family
 - 99213 - Usually the presenting problem(s) are of low to moderate severity and typically 15 minutes are spent with the patient or family
 - 99214 - Usually the presenting problem(s) are moderate to high severity and typically 25 minutes are spent with the patient or family
 - 99215 - Usually the presenting problem(s) are moderate to high severity and typically 40 minutes are spent with the patient or family

BH CPT Codes

- Behavioral health procedure codes (the documentation of these codes have different requirements from the E and M codes):
 - 90791 - Psychiatric diagnostic evaluation without medical services
 - 90792 - Psychiatric diagnostic evaluation with medical services
 - 90832 - Psychotherapy, 30 minutes
 - 90834 - Psychotherapy, 45 minutes
 - 90837 - Psychotherapy, 60 minutes
 - 90847 - Family psychotherapy

BH CPT add-ons

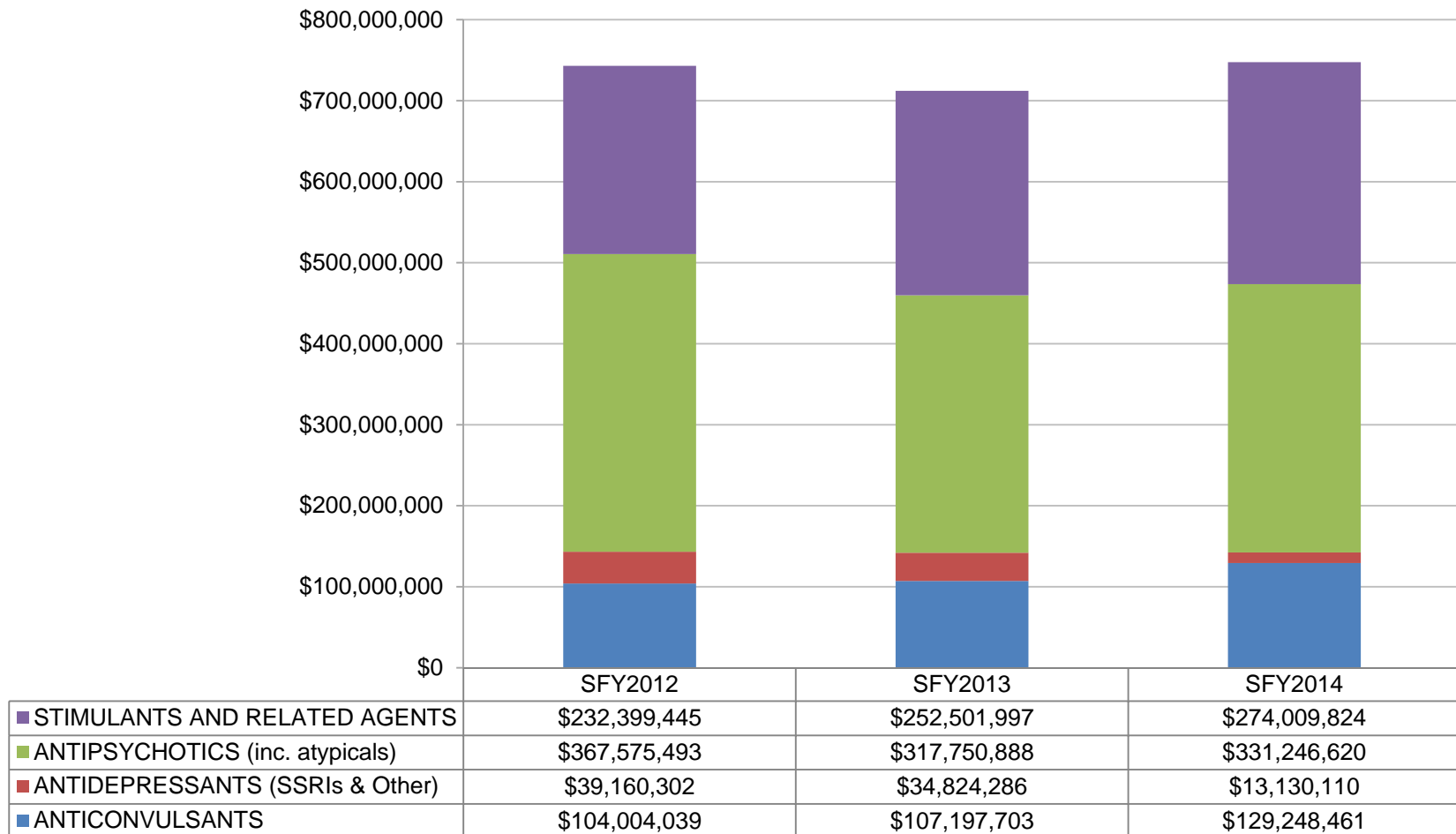
- Behavioral Health add-on procedure codes to bill in addition to E/M codes:
 - +90853 - Group Psychotherapy
 - +90833 - Psychotherapy, 30 minutes
 - +90838 - Psychotherapy, 60 minutes

Combined FFS & MCO State Fiscal Years 2012-2014 Expenditures



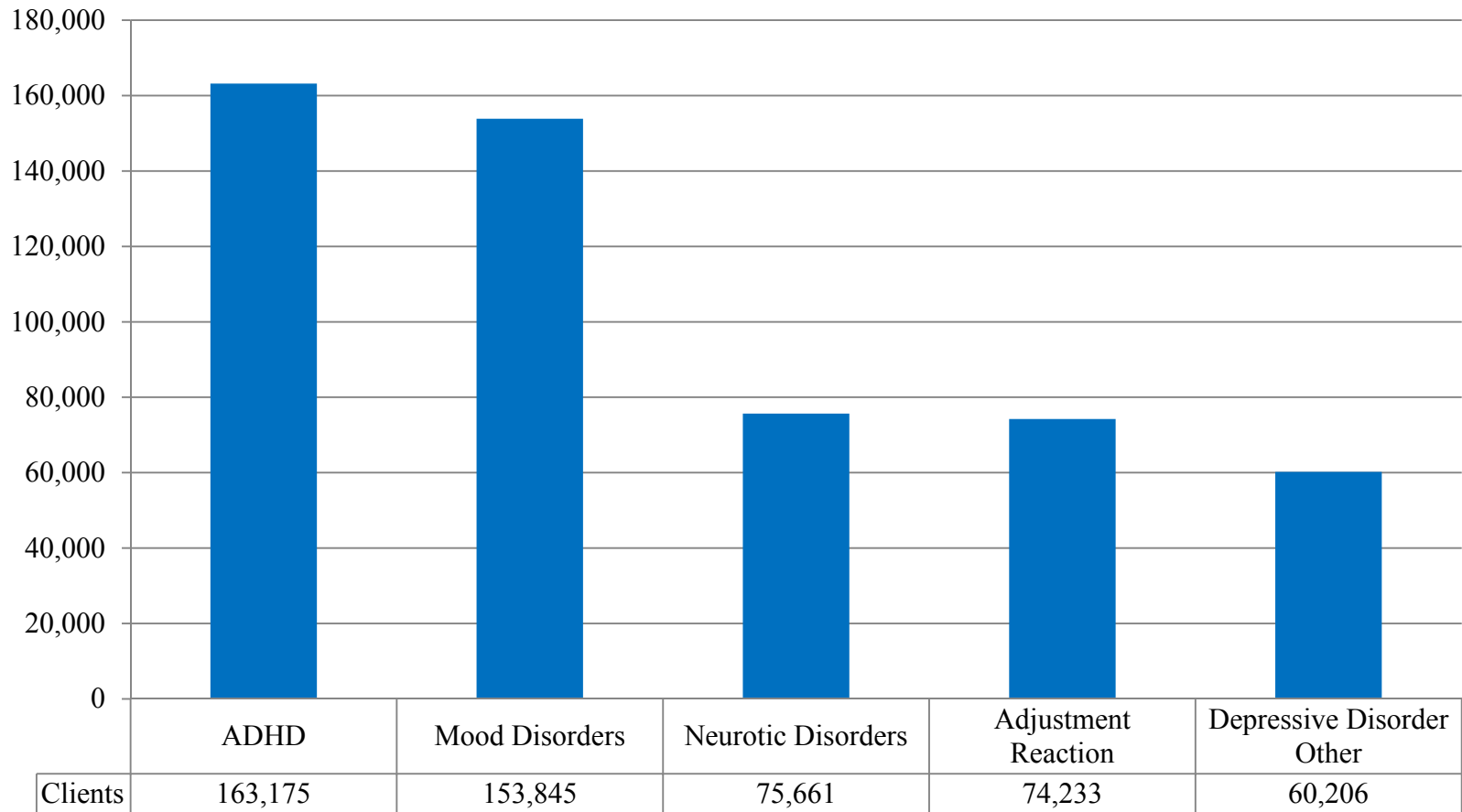


Medication Assisted Treatment Cost (Annual cost)

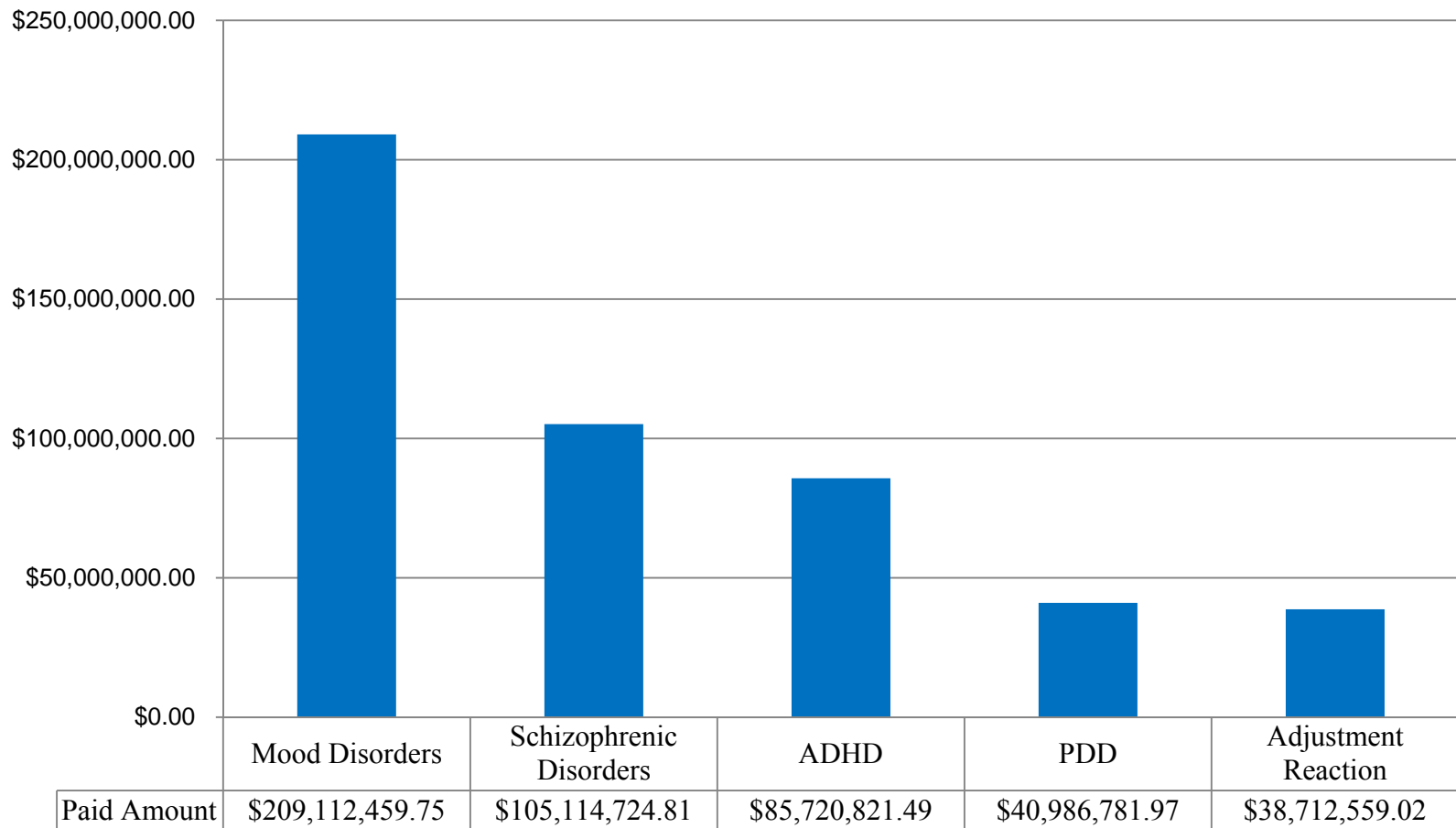

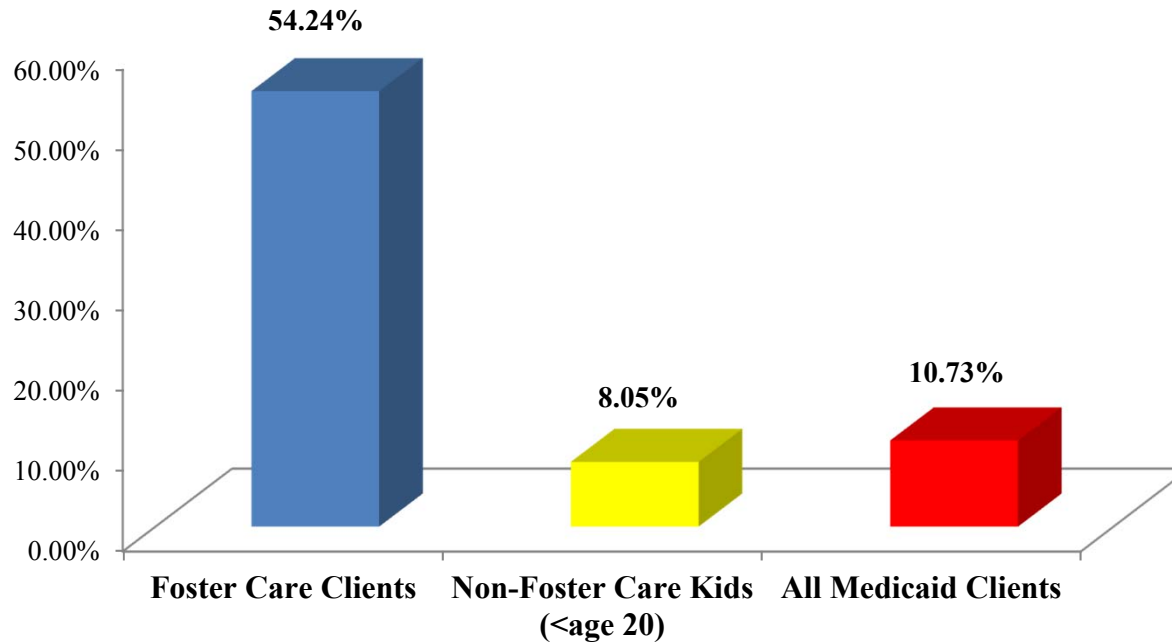
Top 5 Diagnosis: Medicaid Clients



Top 5 Diagnosis: Paid

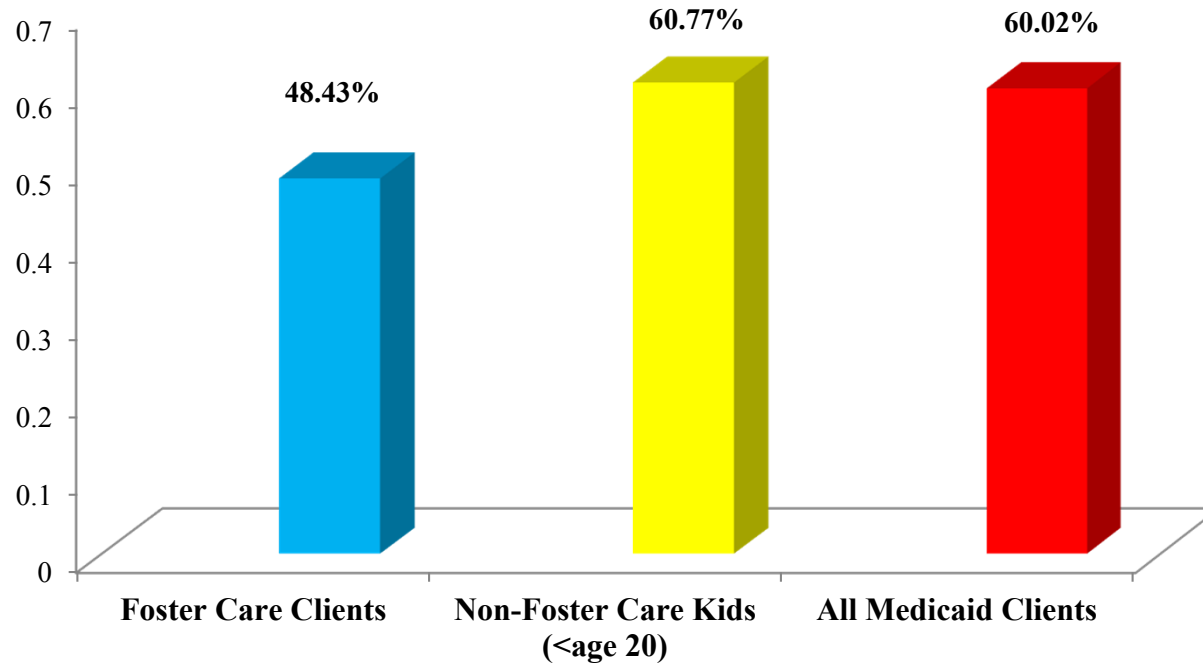

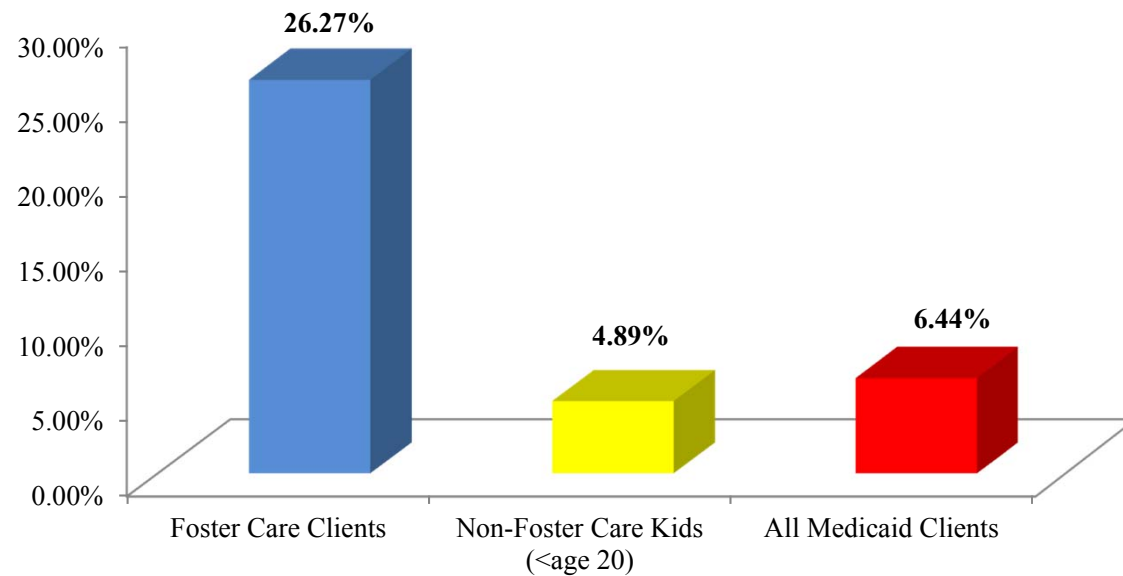

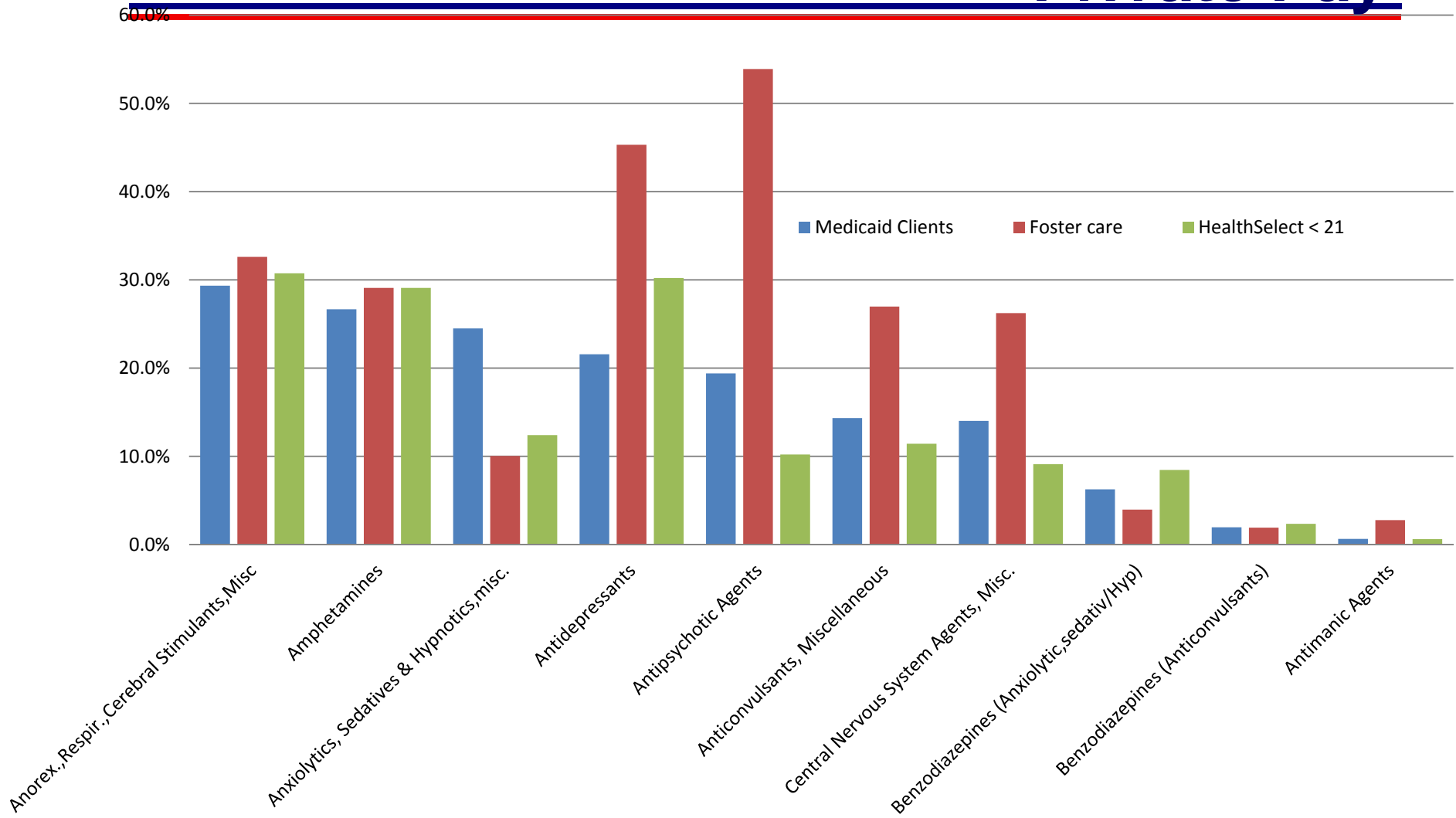

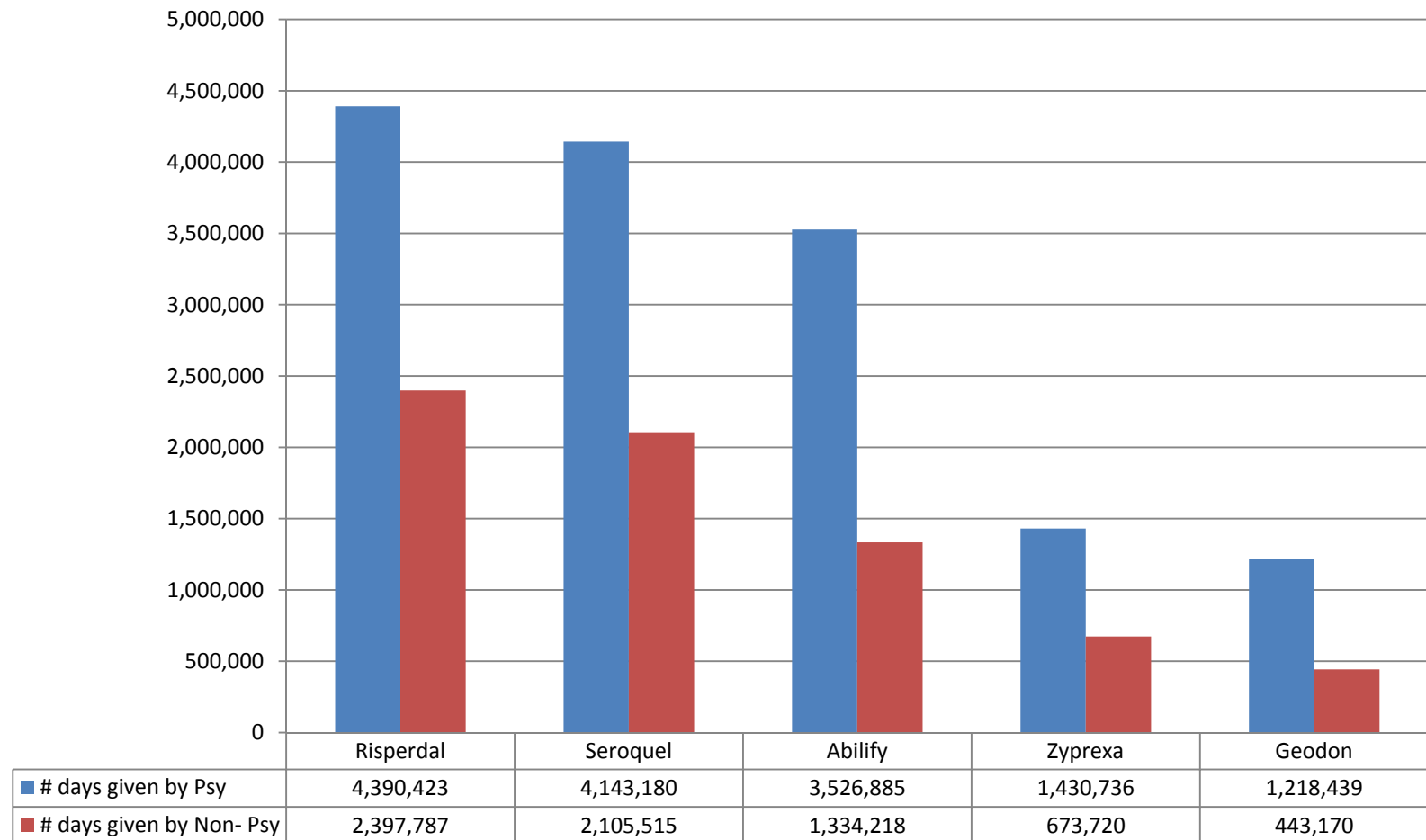

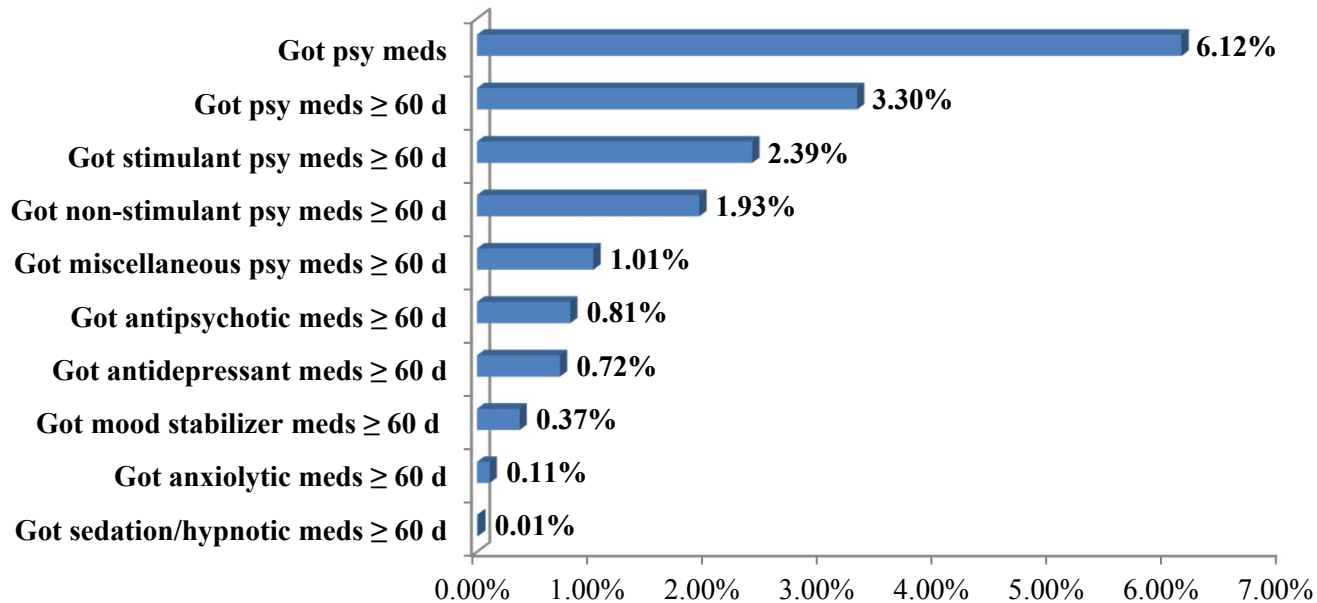
Medicaid, Foster Care and Private Pay
